(DESCRIPTIONS)

Point	Description
GB02	Directly in front of the ear hole is a depression that enlarges when the mouth is open. 1/2 cun below that point is GB2.
LI04	On the back of the hand between the thumb and index finger metacarpal bones. Find the spot midway on the bone that connects the index finger to the wrist. Sometimes this point is easy to find by squeezing two fingers together to form a small mound and marking an imaginary point at the peak of that mound. Then probe inward toward the main body of the hand, right on the bone.
LV03	Two cun above the separation between the biggest and second toes, on the top side of the foot.
SI19	Directly in front of the ear opening in a depression which will deepen when the mouth is open.
ST06	Between the upper and lower jaw, on the muscle that bulges when the back teeth are clenched.
ST07	In the depression between the inferior border of the zygomatic arch and the mandibular notch. On a line from the ear lobe to the corner of the eye, 2 cun from the ear lobe.
T17	Just behind the ear, along the rear of the jaw bone in the depression between the mastoid process and the mandible.
T21	SI19 is directly in front of the ear opening in a depression which will deepen when the mouth is opened. T21 is 1/2 cun above this point.
ELO08	TMJ, ANTI-DEPRESSANT POINT, SALIVARY GLAND (PAROTID GLAND)
ELO06	UPPER JAW, MAXILLA, VERTEX, HIPPOCAMPUS, TEMPORAL CORTEX, AUDITORY LINE, PARIETAL CORTEX
ELO07	LOWER JAW, MANDIBLE, CHIN, PONS
EAH01	UPPER CERVICAL VETERBRAE, CEREBELLUM
EAH02	LOWER CERVICAL VERTEBRAE, TORTICOLLIS

EPL06	
EHX01	Master Point 0, Point of Support, Solar Plexus, Umbilical Cord, Penis, or Clitoris, Sexual Desire, Bosch Point, Diaphragm, Hiccups. Located in a notch at the beginning of the Helix Root. This point brings the whole body toward a state of homeostatic balance
